

## Quiz in Death of Young Film Actress Today

Inquest into the death of Regina Doyle, 24-year-old motion-picture actress, of 1752 Whitley avenue, who was killed instantly yesterday when her expensive sedan smashed into a Pacific Electric freight train, at 1925 North Highland avenue, was set for 1:30 p.m. today by the County Coroner.

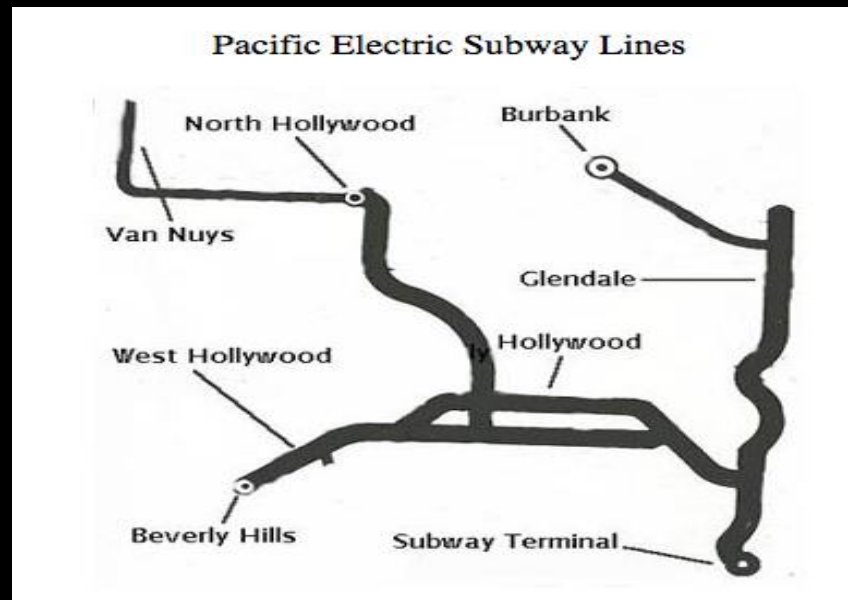
Miss Doyle, traveling south on Highland, was thrown clear of her machine after it had skidded 121 feet and struck the left front corner of the train's motor. The automobile was demolished and she was dead when Receiving Hospital ambulances arrived at the scene.

The train, in charge of Motorman Leeds and Conductor Aubrey, had come to a complete stop before the impact. Witnesses told police the actress was going at a high rate of speed when she hit the electric car. She was employed at a Hollywood studio.
