- 3. Record at least two examples of the following:

- 4. Record an example of Yeats' use of *contrast*.
- 5. Develop the similarities between Coole Park, Innisfree, and Sleuth Wood.
- 6. Explicate the symbolic meaning of "autumn," "October" and "twilight."
- 7. Explicate the meaning of the "dry" pathway
- 8. Explicate the symbolic meaning of the swans , and Yeats use of contrast to develop this meaning.
- 9. Record an example of words/images that reinforce the theme of the "two-in-one," or the merger of two things.
- 10. List some of the poem's themes, with references to the text.
