## "Hetch Hetchy Valley":

## A Learning/Writing Sequence

### Free-Write: Journal Reading-Response

- 1. Describe a place in nature you love, free-writing on its right to exist and the need to preserve it. Experiment with sensory details (sights, sounds, smells, etc), dramatic verbs, and imagery.
- 2. Follow-up: post to your study group.

#### Possible Writing Themes, Midterm Paper 6-8p paper):

- 1. Style/ Rhetorical analysis: Analyze the elements of Muir's style, citing examples from the text, organizing your analysis into several categories/criteria of evidence.
- 2. Polemic: With respect to our National Parks, which is more important, Preservation or Recreation: the need to conserve them in their natural state or to insure that they remain accessible for the public's enjoyment?

**Questions/ Instructions:** in your journal, record and respond to the following to share in class discussion.

- 1. A quote that resonates with you;
- **2.** A quote that evidences Muir's critique of civilization, its machines, and their destructive impact on nature.
- **3.** Examples of the definitive elements of Muir's style (personification, sensory details, dramatic verbs, figurative devices et al)
- **4.** Evidence of his expertise as a Naturalist and/or or his scientific discourse.
- **5.** Comparison/contrast with Yeats or Lame Deer

**Additional prompts:** (Substitute for one of the above, except #1).

- 5. Record an example of Muir's appeals to *ethos, logos, or pathos*.
- 6. Record an example of his *counter-arguments* to draining Hetch Hetchy Valley to build a damn.
- 7. Why do you suppose Muir begins his argument with a *description* of the Valley?
- 8. Free -write on Muir's use of *comparison/contrast* (Hetch Hetchy = Yosemtie Valley) Why is this effective? What is his logic here, his appeal
- 9. Cite some examples of Muir's *biblical references*, and free write on the significance/implications of this.
- 10. Free-write on the logic behind Muir detailed description of the *biological diversity* (flora and fauna) of Hetch Hetchy and of its *geologic features*. Which of Aristotle's appeals is relevant here?
- 11. Muir's writing balances objective and subjective detail. Record an example of his use *subjective* details? How is this rhetorical strategy effective in making his argument?
- 12. Free-write: Voice your own *opinion* on this critical debate, using some reasons of the opposing view as a springboard into an elaboration of your own perspective. Posit some *solutions*. Further prompts: Is "*decommissioning*" or taking down the damn and restoring Hetch Hetchy to its natural state a viable option in your view?
- 13. Free Write: Are we *loving our national Parks to death?* When it comes to our national Parks, which is more important: *Preservation or Recreation?* Should *automobiles* be banned from Yosemite, Zion? Should *snowmobiles* be banned from Yellowstone? Should *off-road vehicles* (ATVs) be banned from wilderness areas? Should *wave-runners* be banned from Lake Tahoe (clouding of water from aviation fuel)? Posit some *solutions to* this National Parks conflict.
