- 5. What machine first triggers his rebellious critique of "the machine age" and the excesses of the Industrial Order, driving him deep into the desert?
- 6. Cite other examples of his critique of civilization in these chapters?
- 7. Comparative analysis: Are there any similarities between Yeats, Lame Deer, Muir, and Abbey in the respective critiques of civilization, elements of style, fusion of spiritual and natural etc?
- 8. Cite two or more examples of Abbey's eye as a Naturalist in Chs 1-3?
- 9. Cite an example of his subjective voice reacting to nature (the desert).
- 10. Record an example of Abbey's effective use of sensory detail to evoke the desert?

- 11. What aspects of the desert is he particularly moved by?
- 12. What does Abbey's adoption of the gopher snake in Ch 3 reveal about him?
- 13. What are the most striking elements of his description of the snakes' mating dance?
- 14. Record an example of Abbey's use of imagery in Ch 4, "Cliffrose and Bayonets."
- 15. Record an example of his use of sensory detail.
- 16. How does the section that begins "Inventory" evidence Abbey's credibility as a Naturalist?
